READ: Exo.20:7&16

## 1 INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Two of the Ten Commandments deal with the tongue.
- 2. There are many good reasons for those two commandments.
- 3. When God created man, he set man apart from all creation by giving him ability to think.
- 4. Man expresses his thoughts vocally through the gift of speech.
- 5. The tongue can gladden or sadden.
- 6. Each of the commandments were given to protect things that are valuable, such as God, parents, life, home, and property.
- 7. This commandment seeks to protect a man's reputation and character against testimony in court, blackmail, and slander.

### 2 DISCUSSION:

- 1. LET'S LOOK AT SEVERAL SCRIPTURES THAT SPEAK AGAINST BEARING FALSE WITNESS.
- 2. Psa. 120:2, Psa.141:3, READ BOTH.
- 3. Solomon wrote that there were 7 things which were an abomination to God.
  - a. Two of them were a lying tongue, and a false witness that uttereth lies.
  - b. He also said that lying lips were an abomination unto Jehovah. (Prov.6:16&12:22).
  - c. Prov.19:5, READ.
  - d. Matt.12:34 Jesus taught, READ. "
  - e. Matt.12:36-37, READ.
  - f. Eph.4:25, READ.

#### WHAT CAN WE DO TO STOP THE BEARING OF FALSE WITNESS?

- 1. An awareness of the damage it can do can help to stop it.
  - a. It was a lie that plunged the human race into sin and death.
  - b. Satan said to Eve she would not die, if she ate the forbidden fruit.
  - c. Rom.5:12 read.
- 2. False witnesses discouraged Israel.
  - a. The ten spies did not give a true picture of Canaan. (Num.13:14 READ).
  - b. The lying tongue of Simon Peter brought him tremendous sorrow. (Matt.26:70-75 READ).
  - c. Jesus was accused of having a demon. (Jn.8:49 READ).
  - d. He was accused of being a glutton and winebibber. (Matt.11:19 READ).
  - e. False witnesses were brought in at the mock trial of Jesus. (Matt.26:59-68 READ).
  - f. Even at His resurrection the Soldiers boar false witness by saying that the disciples came and stole the body of Jesus while they slept. (Matt.28:13).
- 3. The victim of false witness suffers, his character is often destroyed.
  - a. Prov.22:1, READ.

- b. Many lose family, business, and health because of some slanderous attack.
- 4. The liar himself defiles his body. James 3:6, READ
  - a. He shows what is really inside himself.
  - b. Matt.12:34, READ.
  - c. The spiritual condition of the liar is shown by the way he uses his tongue. James 1:26, READ.
  - d. In ancient Egypt the bearer of false witnesses had his nose and ears cut off.
  - e. The Romans pushed them off a cliff.
- 5. In Athens a liar was given a heavy fine.
  - a. If a person was convicted three times for bearing false witness, he lost his civil rights.
  - b. E. Yet, there is something far worse in store for the liar.
  - c. The liar will be in the lake of brimstone. (Rev.21:8).
  - d. Rev.21:27, READ.
  - e. Rev.22:15, READ.

#### HOW DO WE VIOLATE THIS COMMANDMENT?

- 1. By a plain boldfaced lie!
  - a. Why do many lie like this?
  - b. To take the sting out of a particular situation.
  - c. To rub the glitter off of another's crown.
  - d. Jealousy and an inferiority complex cause many to lie.
- 2. False advertisement breaks this law.
- 3. Using flattery to get what you want.
- 4. Insulting and unjust criticism transgresses this command.
- 5. READ: Matt.7:1-5.
- 6. Hypocrisy is condemned by this regulation. Titus 1:16, READ.
- 7. Being willing to listen to false witness puts one's soul in jeopardy. Mark 4:24, READ.
- 8. Slanderous gossip is wrong. Lev.19:16, READ.
- 9. We can violate this by remaining silent when we ought to speak up.
- 10. Solomon said, there is a time to keep silence and a time to speak up." (Eccl.3:7).
- 11. Many like Ananias and Sapphira lie to God. (Acts.5:1-11 READ).
- 12. Half truths; The little white lie; Exaggerations will also cause men to break this commandment.
- 13. Excuses are nothing more than lies wrapped up in tissue paper. Take the wrapping off and you have a lie.

#### VI. HOW DO WE AVOID BREAKING THIS COMMANDMENT?

- 1. By being aware of the source of all falsehood.
- 2. Jesus said that the Devil was a liar and the father thereof. (Jn.8:44).
- 3. If we imitate God, we will never violate this law. Matt.5:44-45, READ.
  - a. 1. Paul urges all men to imitate Jesus. (1 Cor.11:1 READ.).
  - b. 2. If we imitate God, we will not lie, for it is impossible for God to lie. (Heb.6:18; Titus 1:2).
- 4. If we learn to love our neighbor as ourselves (Matt.22:39), we will not lie about our neighbor.
- 5. We must not only learn to love truth, we must learn to speak the truth in love. (Eph.4:15).

- 1. The scriptures are plain concerning God's attitude towards false witness.
- 2. The Bible declares loudly and clearly, don't do it!
- 3. Let's make up our mind, the we will use our tongues to the glory of God.
